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The item that got me into sewing was a sling. I was getting ready to go to an NTC rotation and I wanted a specific sling, and I decided that I could most likely make it. Well over a year and a half later I'm addicted to making gear, I swear I check this site more than a teenie bopper checks myspace.

Anyway, I haven't seen a tutorial for a bungee sling, even though it's pretty straight foreword and simple, I thought I might just give it a try.

So, to start with, Materials:

1" black tubular webbing (30" piece and a 6" piece)

3/16" Shock Cord (16" piece x3)

1" SRB

1" H&K style hook



Step 1: On one end of the 30" piece fold over 1/2" and then that fold 3/4" and box x. This end will be

attached to a d-ring/snaplink. You should have a 3/4" 'hole' at this end.



Step 2: Line up the three pieces of shock cord and about 1/2" from the ends stitch them together. Make sure they are not twisted. Or make sure they ARE twisted if thats what youre going for.
NOTE: I prefer to use multiple pieces of thinner shock cord as opposed to using one thicker piece. I makes the sling lay flatter over your shoulder.



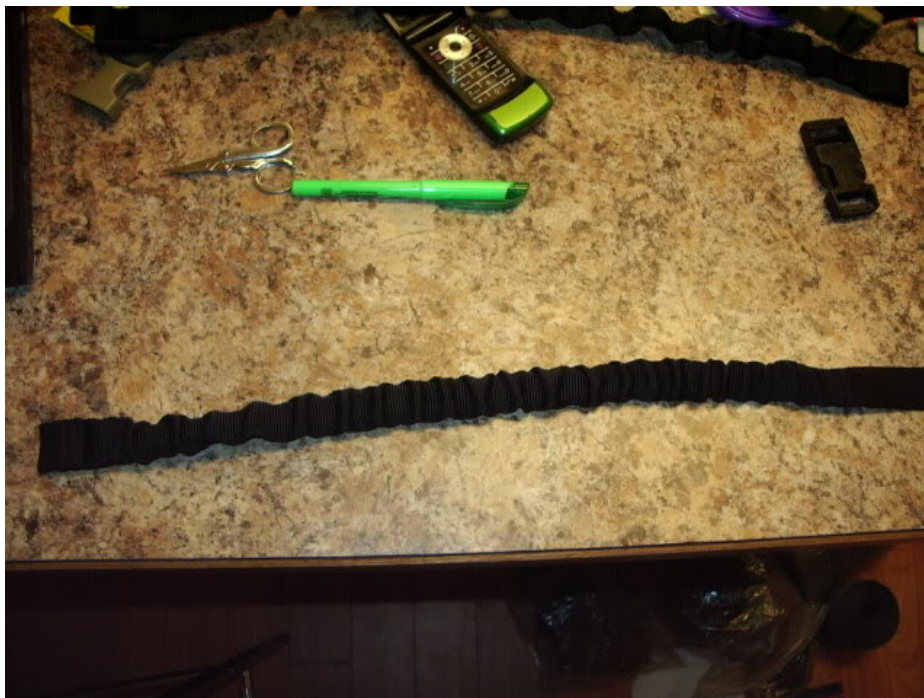
Step 3: Insert your shock cord into the open end of the webbing. I put it about an inch from the loop at the end. Box X over the shock cord.



Step 4: Scrunch up the ammount of bounce you desire. I left only about 5" on the open end. Box X over the shock cord.



Now it should resemble a sling. Put your SRB on the open end, and finish of the end of the webbing.



Step 6: Put the other end of the SRB and the hook on the 6" piece of webbing folded in thirds. Box X in place. If you aren't going to use the H&K hook your mash hook could go here, or you could just use a bigger piece of webbing to go around the weapon.



And Thats it. This is what it would look like on a vest attached to the drag handle.

I'm not 100% sure about the shock cord I have, cause I'm not sure who made it. But to give you an idea, in my garage with ONE strand secured to my pull up bar it held me up without breaking. I weigh 175. When making these slings I make sure that the 'extra' scrunched up webbing, when fully stretched out isn't fully stretching the shock cord. In other words the shock cord could stretch further than it is in the sling.
